

1) What is Autobiography?

_A self-written account of the life of oneself.
Autobiography is always subjective and
everything in it can't be true. It reveals events in
order and sequence.

However, a memoir is different from Autobiography. It doesn't care for chronological order. It mostly focuses on memories, feelings and emotions.

2) Life of Christy Brown (1932-1981)

- *He was suffering from paralysis and could not move any organ of his body except his left foot.
- *He could not talk, walk, eat or bathe on his own. But, still he became a poet, novelist and painter. How? Watch/read till end.
- * Born in Ireland in 1932. Had 22 siblings. 13 lived and 9 died in infancy.
- * Patrick and Bridget were his parents.
- * A social worker, katriona Delahunt helped him to read.
- * A writer, Robert collis, helped him to write books and got his first book, My Left Foot published in 1954 and that made paralytic christy an international celebrity.

* A married American woman, Beth Moore read his book, exchanged letters with Christy, fell in love and wanted to marry him. Their relationship lasted about ten years. But, Christy fell in love with another girl Mary Carr and married her in 1972. She was habitually unfaithful and had an abusive nature. She perhaps killed christy in 1981 but it was said in media that christy died with choking food.

- * christy depended on alcohol.

- * Christy was problematic like Stephen Hawking, John Nash, Frida Kahlo, Nick vujicic and Helen Keller. He was not normal but he did something which many people can't even dream of.

6) Textual Questions:

Q. No. 1 How did Christy's mother know that her son was physically impaired?

She fought all alone with the whole world for her son. In short, she was an ideal mother who had all motherly qualities and merits.

Character sketch of Christy

Christy Brown was a physically challenged person. He was suffering from cerebral palsy. He could neither speak nor mumble. He could not walk, eat, drink, change his dress, help himself in wash room or sit anywhere without any help or support. He made stiff snakelike movements unless he was asleep. His fingers twisted continually. His arms twisted backwards. He could not hold his head steady. He looked a queer and crooked little fellow. He didn't show any sign of intelligence till he was five. The doctors declared him a mentally challenged person. However, he had a loving mother who changed his fate. She taught him the art of writing. Later, he was able to write a number of books with his left foot. His Autobiography is titled MY LEFT FOOT. His character is a great source of inspiration for others. He proved that it is possible to achieve the impossible with faith and support from one's family.

Write the theme of the chapter The Letter A?

The chapter, "The Letter A" implies that faith together with hard work is stronger than everything else. Faith makes the impossible things possible. It is a great helper of a faithful and it often surprises a faithless. The mother of Christy Brown had faith that her son was mentally alright although the high qualified doctors declared him a case beyond hope and cure. She didn't heed to the opinion of doctors and gave her son proper love, care, support and attention. She, at last, proved that with the help of faith, one can achieve most difficult or apparently impossible goals by teaching her crippled son to express himself through writing. She was able to achieve through her faith something which astonished everybody including the efficient doctors.
